### **Higher Education Degree shows**

### South Africa trip

The FdSc Conservation Science students spent an incredible two weeks in South Africa for a trip of a life time. As part of their course, these learners flew out to Umphafa private game reserve, who are partnered with Colchester zoo, to offer some amazing, hands on conservation experiences!

The team were shown around the reserve, put up trap cameras, visited a top five game reserve and took part in an anti-poaching day, which consisted of finding snares and trying to outrun the trained rangers in the bush!

The students have all gained so many skills and taken good care of each other on the reserve.

### Vietnam trip

A group of our Travel and Tourism students spent two weeks in Ho Chi Minh, Vietnam! They undertook a life-changing volunteer project and studied tourism in South East Asia!

During the first week, the students lived in a tourism college and volunteered in a soup kitchen. For their second week, they visited the Mekong Delta, Can Gio eco park, Vung Tau beach resort and the black virgin mountains and the Cu Chi tunnels.

This educational trip was made possible thanks to winning the Turing Scheme funding, which meant that the trip was fully funded for our students.

Our first year Performing Arts students went to Plaisir Place in Lowestoft to sing for residents and the local community.

# **VENI Project**

The VENI team at Projects had a busy time during the Easter break hosting multiple first aid and personal alcohol license courses for locals working in the hospitality and catering sector.

Two first aid courses were held at The Hotel Victoria in Lowestoft and introduced their employees to the importance of emergency assistance in the workplace. Attendees found the course to be highly enjoyable as they were able to demonstrate CPR and apply slings and bandages on one another.

To gain their license to serve alcohol, staff from the Clairemont Pier as well as other local hospitality employees, attended the personal alcohol license course to learn the different types of licenses when selling drinks to the public. They were assessed at the end of their course and everyone passed with flying colours!

The Visitor Economy Network Initiative creates opportunities for young people and people working in the sector in Great Yarmouth and Waveney to develop work-ready skills and participate in, and learn more about, their local visitor economy.

### Library: New online resource

### Online Safety: Snapchat and Al

A large number of social media platforms have launched or are planning to launch Ale enhancements. Conversational AI - ie technology that you 'chat' with - can be very useful, but the technology is so new that it is causing problems in some areas. Snapchat has come to light in college as one system lots of students are using, sometimes without considering the implications of what the AI is doing.

Snapchat has a dedicated page on its website that addresses some of the questions users may have, but which also includes the following statement: "We're constantly working to improve and evolve My AI, but it's possible My AI's responses may include biased, incorrect, harmful, or misleading content. Because My AI is an evolving feature, you should always independently check answers provided by My AI before relying on any advice, and you should not share confidential or sensitive information."

### Careers and Higher Education fairs

In April, we hosted two whole college events. Firstly, we were joined by several organisations linked to careers in the Criminal Justice System, this included some of the visible careers like the Police Force and the Crown Prosecution Service but also representatives from Aviva's Fraud department. It included a session run by a UEA Criminology academic for our students who came over from Great Yarmouth for the event – putting them front and centre of the decision to prosecute someone who had been arrested. It was a fascinating insight into what goes on behind the scenes.

We were then joined by over 20 universities and degree apprenticeship providers from across the county at events at both our Lowestoft and Yarmouth campuses. This was a great opportunity for students and parents to start conversations about higher education and what that might look like. Feedback from the universities was that they had had positive talks with students who might not otherwise have considered university, and helped bust some myths around student finance as well.

On June 14th, we are taking students to the University of Essex in Colchester for a UCAS Higher Education Fair. Please email careers@eastcoast.ac.uk for availability of last-minute tickets. The trip is free to attend and all transport is provided.





As we move into the final weeks of this year we look to support students with their next steps and in some cases new choices. From confidence building and strengthening communication skills to exploring support from employment and self-employment we have lots of connections to projects and support that young people can access.
