They trained the studio staff on its operation and how to link it live with unreal engine to create a live filming set-up which uses a live tracking of the camera motion and the motion of the live actors.

This is exciting and current technology for the BA Visual Effects and Post-Production degree students to have available for their studies, one of their modules specifically looks at immersive technologies, an area of significant growth in the creative industries.

Virtual Production is a relatively new production method and one that is developing fast within the industry. We are really pleased to be at the cutting edge in using this technology in our teaching and on the degree programme.
