CREATIVE ARTS -JAPAN TRIP



Our Art students have been busy on their Turing trip in Japan, soaking up the vibrant culture and exploring a number of exciting locations.

Highlights of the trip include visits to Tokyo where students visited its Yokohama Silk Museum and Kyoto where students explored the Arashiyama Bamboo Forest and the Nishi Hongan-ji Temple. On the next stop on their journey, students stopped into various shops in the vibrant districts of Osaka. On their travels, students have also had the pleasure of seeing Mount Fuji and the iconic cherry blossoms that the region is famous for.

The group has been using the "Osaka Amazing Pass" to visit over 40 attractions, such as abseiling off the Osaka Tower and a trip to the glowing teamLab botanical garden!

The students have explored locations of cultural and historical significance, discovered art and traditions unique to the regions, tasted local cuisine and been involved in many exciting excursions and activities. All of which was made possible by the fantastic Turing Scheme.

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ARTS AND MEDIA -BARCELONA TRIP



Our Arts and Media began their exciting trip to Barcelona.

Highlights from the trip include immersing themselves in the local culture and visiting the Picasso Museum, the Barcelona Cathedral, the Dali Museum, and the Museum of Contemporary Art.

They also visited the Sagrada Familia, where they had a guided tour of the building to learn more about Antoni Gaudi and the 'Sacred Family Church'.

In between the busy itinerary of exploring Barcelona's wonderful art and architecture, students also found time to explore the beautiful parks and beaches Barcelona has to offer.

SHREWSBURY PRISON



Students from Levels 2 and 3 in Psychology, Criminology and Law, Health T Level, and Health and Social Care Level 3 participated in an overnight stay "behind bars" at Shrewsbury Prison.

Upon arrival, the group met a stern guard who distributed orange boilersuits and assigned cells. With peeling paint and the basics—a rusted bunk marked by former inmates, a sink, and a single plug socket—they prepared for a tough night.

Students were split into teams for escape room challenges. Some, including their law tutor Chris, faced "the hole," wearing hoods and chained together, while others attempted to navigate their cells. Afterwards, they gathered in the canteen for a meal known as "prison slop" (sausages and mash) before exploring the prison and even visiting the gift shop.

They toured the intake process for new prisoners, learning about inmate classification and wing assignments. Highlights included a visit to the notoriously haunted C Block and the execution room, as well as the medical block discussing care for injuries and overdose treatment.

ANDREW BARTON VISITS HAIRDRESSING



We were delighted to welcome celebrity hairdresser Andrew Barton back to our Images salon at our Lowestoft Campus. Having first visited us in 2024, Andrew returned this year for another truly inspirational day.

PERSIMMON HOMES DONATION



Persimmon Homes recently donated 10,000 bricks to both our Lowestoft and Great Yarmouth Brickwork departments to support our students and apprentices in their studies. After the bricks were delivered, we had the opportunity to give the team a tour of our facilities and showcase some of the work our learners undertake here at college.

The bricks provided were custom-made in the Persimmon factory, which began production during COVID when they were unable to source enough bricks to complete house builds. These bricks differ from the usual training bricks used by students and apprentices, offering them the chance to test their skills with different materials.

The college's ongoing relationship with Persimmon will continue to shape the curriculum for all construction trades, providing site visits, work experience, and apprenticeships. Persimmon has also offered to support our sustainability strategy, which will, in turn, help them reduce waste—an exciting opportunity for the coming months and years.

GUEST SPEAKER -VIETNAM WAR

VIETNAM TRIP



The recent trip to Vietnam offered students a fantastic opportunity to immerse themselves in the local culture while enhancing their knowledge and understanding of international tourism. During this trip, they also provided valuable service to the community by volunteering at a homeless shelter, where they prepared and served food to those in need.

The group met with their Vietnamese coordinator and soup kitchen instructors for feedback. It was very positive! Residents and the shelter manager praised the students for being respectful and a resident noted that the desserts they made were the best they had in years, reminding them of their food from their childhood. Staff also saw noticeable progression in the students even in their brief time with them.

Other highlights from the trip included dining at local restaurants, exploring the area and enjoying an evening of karaoke with the Vietnamese team and other international volunteers.

Students shared how the project impacted them and how it has contributed to their personal development.

Students are now in phase two of their journey, where they have already visited an orphanage and school, received cooking lessons on local cuisine and next they will go on to further explored aspects of the Asian tourism industry.

APOLLO SESSION -BREAKING BARRIERS



The Apollo team had the honour of hosting the Breaking Barriers Innovation Team, leaders of the Coastal Navigator Network Programme at the Great Yarmouth campus. This strategic collaboration between NHS England and the Integrated Care Board aims to reduce barriers and increase employment opportunities in six coastal towns, including Great Yarmouth.

The day began with engaging sessions where students and Apollo participants shared their perspectives on living and working in Great Yarmouth, discussing their aspirations for the future. This was followed by a roundtable discussion with local stakeholders from the DWP, Borough Council, ICB (Intergrated Care Board), GPs, Education and Hospital, addressing local challenges, projects and funding.

The Apollo team presented the project to representatives from other coastal towns within the Network. The comprehensive report, including insights from the Apollo programme, will be presented to Professor Chris Whitty, the Chief Medical Officer for England.
